His extensive research on economics, decision-making and human behaviour provides valuable insights into incentives, social preferences, and behavioral anomalies, offering new perspectives on how individuals make choices in various economic contexts. His work includes over 100 peer-reviewed journal articles, earning him the Most Highly Cited Researcher prize for the last eight years.

Our moderator for this evening, **Professor Nick Sevdalis**, is an equally accomplished researcher with his work featured in over 450 publications focused on implementation and improvement sciences. He is also a Visiting Professor at NUS, Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, and the current Academic Director for the Centre for Behavioural and Implementation Science Interventions.
