Beyond his notable career in financial services, he is a passionate advocate for philanthropy, education, and the arts — embodying the values that NUSS holds dear.

To our new members, you are joining a vibrant community that is more than just a club. I often liken NUSS to a person. To build a rounded personality, you need to achieve a balance between the body, mind and soul.

Similarly, NUSS seeks to achieve a similar balance. The body of the Society is represented by our physical infrastructure. Our sporting facilities, including the swimming pool and gym are very popular with members. Most sports have interest groups within NUSS that we call sections. These include the Tennis section, Billiards section and Pickleball section, etc. Even without dedicated physical facilities, our golf section is one of the most active at NUSS!

Running our own F&B outlets is also important. There are a total of 10 F&B outlets and bars across our three Guild Houses that serve as key platforms to allow members to meet, socialise and relax. These also enable us to run activities like wine and whiskey pairing dinners, St Patrick's Day celebrations, and, most recently we held an Oktoberfest celebration right here at this Guild Hall. At the end of November, we will be closing our 70th Anniversary celebrations with an NUSS Day Carnival, with DPM Heng Swee Keat as the Guest of Honour.

The mind of the Society is built around our deep commitment to the intellectual engagement and continuous learning of our members. Notably, this year we have welcomed Dato' Onn Hafiz Ghazi, Menteri Besar of Johor, to deliver our 70th Anniversary Lecture on cross strait relations, and Prof Uri Gneezy from UC San Diego who spoke on crafting incentives to influence behaviour. In November, we look forward to welcoming Mdm Halimah Yacob as a guest speaker at our Commentary Dialogue, where she will touch on matters relating to social progress and cohesion. There are also a number of talks and courses that are held all throughout the year and I encourage you to participate if you can.

We are mindful that just focusing on the body and mind will not be meaningful without a soul. Our soul is embodied within our initiatives to raise funds for needy students and giving an avenue for members to participate in cultural interest groups and community care projects. In January, we held the "Plant-it-forward Challenge," where \$1000 was donated for every tree planted, raising \$70,000. More recently, the NUSS Charity Golf Tournament raised \$777,000, where all funds raised went to the NUSS 70th Anniversary Bursary to benefit needy NUS students.

Like our sports sections, our cultural sections are equally active, including DanceSport, DramaWorks, choir, music and many more. Should you be keen to sign up to join any of the cultural or sports sections, I believe the convenors are at the dinner tonight and can address any questions you may have.

In closing, I extend my deepest appreciation to Mr Hsieh Fu Hua for joining us tonight. His presence continues to strengthen the bond between NUSS and the broader NUS community, and we are grateful for his commitment to the future of education in Singapore.

I would also like to welcome all our new members to the NUSS family and may tonight be the start of many fulfilling experiences, enriching friendships, and shared successes. Have a wonderful evening ahead.
